In 1999, the same year his son Paul joined the practice, he performed the first FDA-approved aortic stent graft in Western New York for the treatment of an abdominal aortic aneurysm. Together, father and son created Catholic Health's first stent program for carotid artery disease at Sisters Hospital.

"Catholic Health remains an area leader in vascular surgery and we are proud to work hand in hand with VEC to bring the most advanced vascular care to our community," said Mark A. Sullivan, President & CEO of Catholic Health. "The entire VEC medical team is among the best in the region and we are pleased they have chosen to continue their careers with Trinity Medical."
